1. Welcome, apologies & minutes from the last meeting

Approved. Actions all as agenda items.

2. Paving Works and Severn Trent Works

Nottingham County Council have started the work on the paving scheme, they are currently working between West End Street and Bailey Street.

There have been some major disruptions with the Severn Trent works currently being taken out on Derby Road. Broxtowe Borough Council are aware of a number of problems, there have been a number of meetings with the contractors on site and discussion continues daily.

The diversion routes were fixed between Severn Trent and Nottinghamshire County Council (who are responsible for highways) and these cannot be changed.

The Directorate of Health Housing and Leisure at Broxtowe Borough Council have agreed, following a negotiation with John Lockwood and Louise Ashby, that some additional signs (separate from those of Severn Trent) can be placed in Stapleford for the duration of the works. These will move as the closure route/diversion route moves. The signs will say Stapleford Shops and Businesses Open as Usual, and the ones on a diversion route will also say follow diversion.

The signs are being printed on tomorrow (Friday 3rd February) and will be in place on Monday morning. The Severn Trent diversion signs are being made and they have said it will be in place by the 3rd.

Businesses can claim for profit loss. Details of how to do this were on the original letter sent around by Seven Trent.

3. Litter Survey

Paul Syson from Broxtowe Borough Council sent apologise for non-attendance at the last meeting. He has agreed that once the group has formalised how they wish to carry out the litter survey he will collate the results and action as appropriate.

Barbara Brook informed the group that the Stapleford Core Group already carry out a litter survey and they would be prepared to carry out future litter surveys on behalf of the Stapleford Regeneration Group.
