- The Government has made £5million available to support Local Planning Authorities and communities in testing out the Neighbourhood Planning provisions laid out in the Localism Act
- Each Frontrunner community has been awarded £20,000 (given to the LPA) from this fund to support them in the neighbourhood planning process






