

What is Broxtowe Youth Voice?



"Broxtowe Youth Voice frequently collaborates with the Council to develop facilities and programmes for young people. The Broxtowe Youth Mayor is also elected each year and attends and contributes to full Council meetings, on behalf of young people in the Borough. This privilege ensures young people have a platform to voice their issues at the highest local level.

On a national level, Broxtowe Youth Voice elects a member of UK Youth Parliament who is invited to debate in Parliament each year. Recent issues debated include votes at 16, and racial and religious discrimination. Being a part of Broxtowe Youth Voice means you can be a part of key decision making in the Borough, and you get to work with Councillors and other young people to improve Broxtowe for young people. Part 2 Local Plan Update

The Council will publish its Part 2 Local Plan shortly, following on from the Core Strategy which was adopted in 2014.

The Part 2 Local Plan is the detailed plan which includes the specific sites for allocated development (up until 2028) to meet the needs set in the Core Strategy. It also details the policies against which planning applications will be assessed. When the Plan is published, a 6 week consultation will take place inviting you to have your say.

The draft allocations are necessary to ensure the Council can demonstrate a five year housing land supply and to meet the Core Strategy development requirements. These allocations will put the Council in a much stronger position in protecting its Green Belt and other open spaces.

Council Budget

The 2017/18 budget was agreed in March following a public consultation, including:

- No reduction in public services
- No Council Tax increase
- Increase in Garage Rents to a fair market value so maintenance costs are met only by those who rent them
- 1% rent reduction for all Council tenants in line with Government commitments
- Continued work on the Business Strategy to reduce costs and increase income

Almost £975,000 savings had to be found having lost 43% of Revenue Support Grant since 2016/17 and an unexpected reduction in New Homes Bonus. By the end of 2019/20, Government will phase out the grant it provides to Councils altogether.

Whilst spending has been reduced by making savings through a range of initiatives, very difficult decisions have been necessary. The Council will try to protect services that are a priority for its residents moving forward.

POPPIES EEPING WINDOW

BY PAUL CUMMINS ARTIST AND TOM PIPER DESIGNER

Specially presented by 14-18 NOW, the UK's arts programme for the First World War centenary, Weeping Window is a cascade comprising several thousand handmade ceramic poppies seen pouring from a high window to the ground below.

Weeping Window is from the installation 'Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red' – poppies and original concept by artist Paul Cummins and installation designed by Tom Piper – by Paul Cummins Ceramics Limited in conjunction with Historic Royal Palaces, originally at HM Tower of London 2014.

Beeston Redevelopment

The Council continues to work with its specialist advisors on the development of the second phase of The Square in Beeston. This is the largely vacant site, stretching from the former bus station to the site of the former fire station. The preferred option is a mixed use development with a significant element of night time economy such as a cinema and restaurants.

It is intended to undertake the necessary procurement later this year and to commence construction in 2018.



Free Wi-Fi For Stapleford



Visitors to Stapleford town centre can now benefit from the first Wi-Fi zone of its kind locally.

To access the free Wi-Fi visitors will log onto the network through an official landing page via Facebook, Twitter or form using valid email address/mobile phone details. Local businesses will also be given the opportunity to advertise, promote offers and latest news.

As part of the deal, two footfall counters will be installed to monitor footfall and see what impact the Wi-Fi network has.

£25,000 has been invested in the project, which has been part funded by a government grant to boost town centres.

Do you know where your rubbish is going?



Fly tipping is a serious crime and you have a duty of care to ensure that your rubbish is disposed of properly. If you hire someone to dispose of your rubbish and they fly-tip it, **you** could face a fine of up to £50,000, a criminal record or even be sent to prison.

When hiring a waste carrier you should:

- Ask the waste carrier to provide you with their full address and telephone number.
- Ask to see their waste carrier licence issued by the Environment Agency or Natural Resources Wales.
- Contact the Environment Agency and ask for a free instant Waste Carrier Validation Check

Before a holiday

- Make your home look lived in could a trusted person collect your post, cut your lawn or park their car on your drive?
- Avoid discussing holiday plans where strangers may hear



 Lock doors and windows and set your burglar alarm

In your garden

 Keep your shed in good condition, fittings should be bolted through the door and screws concealed, fit a shed alarm

- Well positioned external lighting can deter intruders
- Keep tools secure, they could be used to force entry into your home



- Chain large items together and consider relocating valuables inside
- Mark your valuables with your postcode and house name or number

General advice

- Fit good quality locks on doors and windows - if you can get into your home without your keys, so can a burglar
- Keep keys away from windows and doors



 Never leave valuables in your vehicle or leave it unsecured



What's Happening In Our Parks & Open Spaces



Bramcote Hills Park

The Council has been working with Bramcote Hills Park Community Interest Company to introduce a community café and toilet facilities. The company has chosen architects to design the building but more work on funding and planning permission is required. Coronation Park

£26,000 of improvements have been made including better access routes and a new entrance for the bowling green. Lime trees were also planted to create an avenue along one of the main paths. The project was funded by housing developer contributions from the Morel Close scheme in Eastwood.



Smithurst Road Play Area

Play area improvement works will begin soon with £36,000 secured from housing developers to increase the range of play facilities on site for children of all ages.

Inham Nook Recreation Ground

Final phase of the improvement works have now been completed including a new CCTV camera near the skate park and play facilities to help reduce the potential for anti-social behaviour.

Playing Pitch Strategy

A new strategy has been adopted to improve existing outdoor sports pitches and facilities The strategy covers football, cricket, bowls, rugby and hockey.

Wetland Landscapes for All

£28,000 funding has been secured in partnership with Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust from the 6C's New Growth Point Partnership. The County wide project will include habitat and access improvements at three Broxtowe Nature Reserves including Brinsley Headstocks, Hall Om Wong, Kimberley and Toton Fields.



Hall Om Wong Open Space

Children from Gilthill Primary planted 1,000 bluebell bulbs, primrose plants and wildflower seeds, as well as converting a section of grassland to a woodland meadow to attract wildlife. They also made bird boxes, with materials supplied by Beeston Men In Sheds. The project has been run in partnership with Greenwood Community Forest.

This included the work experience project, as well as work on more tenant and community focussed service, from a series of community clean-up days in various areas of the Borough, a Christmas Hamper collection for those who need a helping hand and a commitment to assisting tenants most in need.

Keys Handed Over At Second Dementia Friendly Scheme

The Council's second dementia friendly housing scheme has opened in Beeston, thanks to a partnership project between Broxtowe Borough Council, Nottingham Community Housing Association, Waters Homes and Pelham Architects to build specially designed and adapted bungalows for people with dementia.

The newly built bungalows have been incorporated into the Council's Retirement Living Scheme at Bexhill Court on Central Avenue who gave overwhelming support for the idea and the development.

The homes have been designed to be dementiafriendly with special emphasis on colours, textures and patterns, as people with dementia can struggle with depth perception and patterns can cause confusion.

Colour is also an important issue, to ensure that there is lots of light in the home but that things like doors, light fittings and toilet seats are dark enough to stand out and easy to distinguish. Each room in the dementia friendly bungalows will be a different pastel colour so they are easily identifiable to the resident, even if they are confused or disorientated.

The development offers four x two bedroom bungalows, including a room for carers to help support the needs of individual tenants, together with an additional two x one bedroom bungalows for people who wish to move to Retirement Living.

The project is part of the Council's on-going commitment to be a dementia friendly Council.















Free home visits - The Healthy Housing Service



Health funded Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Healthy Housing Service is now offering free home visits to a limited number of households in Broxtowe. Home visits make it easier to spot the signs of fuel poverty, home safety issues and discuss financial concerns.

Free Home visits are offered to homeowners and private tenants who are:

- aged over 60
- have a disability (people with sight/ hearing problems, restricted movement or learning difficulties)
- · or are chronically ill

So far our home visits have achieved £7,005 worth of energy bill savings, which is an average of £350 per household.

The visit, which lasts about 90 minutes, explores the following key areas:

- Insulation
- Heating

- Energy Switching
- Income Maximisation
- Health & Well-being Services for the over 60s
- Behaviour Change

This service is part funded by Public Health within Nottinghamshire County Council and is managed by Nottingham Energy Partnership, a Queen's award winning environmental climate change charity.
