Following the success of the launch, the Council are now exploring the idea of rolling out similar networks in Beeston, Eastwood and Kimberley town centres.

Dementia Support In Eastwood



After being inspired by Beeston's Memory Café, volunteers in Eastwood have set up their own to support those affected by dementia and their carers.

Volunteers are working together to provide a place to socialise in a safe and friendly space, as well as stimulating mental and physical activities.

The group meet monthly on the 2nd Tuesday of the month, 12.30pm - 3.00pm at Plumptre Hall, behind St Mary's Church, Church Street, Eastwood. There is a £1 charge for each person attending, all money is reinvested into the cafe. A carer must accompany those with dementia. The venue is disabled friendly with good access and parking.

This project has been funded by NHS Nottingham West Clinical Commissioning Group in partnership with Broxtowe Borough Council as part of the Broxtowe Health Partnership.

Beeston Memory Café have been instrumental in supporting the group and helping them to set up.

Beeston - Broadgate Park Improvements and a Newly Refurbished Library

A major redevelopment of Broadgate Park play area is proposed for later this year. To date, £37,000 of funding has been secured from the Council's Housing Modernisation partner United Living, the Tesco Bags of Help scheme and the Borough Council's Capital Programme. A bid for £50,000 has been submitted to Waste Recycling Environmental (WREN), which if successful will allow a major development to take place in late 2017/early 2018.

Beeston Library has now re-opened following extensive refurbishment including a new roof, windows, ceiling, lights, flooring and heating system as well as new shelving, a re-design of public spaces for modern library use, re-opening of the original main entrance on Foster Avenue, a discovery room – a space for hands on learning, creativity and innovation and improvements to meeting areas and exhibition spaces.





What's Happening In Our Parks & Open Spaces

Outstanding Parks Recognised Again

Bramcote Hills Park and Colliers Wood have retained their prestigious Green Flag Awards for their high environmental standards and well maintained facilities. Bramcote Hills Park now celebrates 11 consecutive years as a Green Flag award winner, with Colliers Wood close behind on 9 consecutive awards. Community Green Flags were also awarded to Alexandrina Plantation and Sandy Lane Local Nature Reserve at Bramcote, Brinsley Headstocks and the Old Church Tower at Bramcote.





Smithhurst Road Play Area

This popular play area has been given a full makeover and now has a new range of exciting play equipment. The work was funded by the adjacent housing developer.



Judson Avenue Play Area, Stapleford

Working with the newly formed Friends Group, £5,000 has been from the Tesco Bags of Help scheme and £9,200 from Nottinghamshire County Council's supporting Local Communities Fund. Together with Council funding, this will help improve surfacing and fencing and add new equipment.

Play Strategy

A new strategy has been prepared identifying priorities to improve the play areas in the Borough. It will focus on:

- Well maintained play spaces
- More areas in which to play
- More equipped play provision
- Needs for children and young people to feel safe and secure.

The strategy will increase the prospect of external funding to improve those play areas most in need of new equipment following extensive consultation with local children.

As collections move to monthly between December and February, you can sign up now for the remainder of the 2017/18 season at a reduced rate of £26. Additional bins are £6 each.

2016/17 Annual Report Summary

This summary outlines how we spent the money we received from the Council Tax you pay, business rates, Government grants and other income we receive during the 2016/17 financial year. Around 9% of your Council Tax goes towards providing Broxtowe Services. The rest goes to Nottinghamshire County Council, Nottinghamshire Police and Nottinghamshire Fire Service.

General Fund

Day to day running costs of Council services (except council housing) e.g. salaries, transport, general office running costs and income from fees and charges.

The Council spent a net £0.560m less than it received in funding and £0.426m less than it planned to spend.

£5.3m from council tax

£3.6m from our share of Business Rates

£1.4m Revenue Support Grant from Government

£0.1m from our share of additional Council Tax collected in previous years

Total Income: £10.4 million

Your Budget, Your Say

We're setting the 2018/19 budget and we need your help. In 2016/17 we spent less than we received in funding and less than we planned to spend but the challenge is still great. By the end of 2019/20, Government will phase out the grant it provides to Councils altogether, so we need to make some difficult decisions about where we spend and save your money.







Protect Yourself When Christmas Shopping Online



Shopping for the perfect gifts can be stressful - if you decide to avoid the crowds and purchase your gifts online, take precautions to avoid falling victim of scammer or a dishonest seller. Before making a purchase, make sure you:

 Ensure that the online retailer is reputable
 establish a physical address and telephone contact details



- Before entering payment card details on a website, ensure that the link is secure. It is secure when:
 - A padlock symbol appears in the browser window frame when you attempt to log in or register
 - o The web address begins with 'https://' the 's' stands for 'secure'.
- Credit card payments offer greater protection in terms of fraud, guarantees and non-delivery
- Never pay for goods when using an unsecured Wi-Fi connection.

Top Safety Tips This Winter

During the darker nights and festive celebrations, follow these simple safety tips from The South Nottinghamshire Community Safety Partnership so you don't become a victim of crime this winter

Going out

- Ensure doors, gates and windows are locked
- Invest in a security light and set a burglar alarm
- Don't leave Christmas presents on view

Whilst shopping

- Keep handbags, purses and wallets secure, out of sight and never unattended
- Always close car windows and lock doors
- Park in a well-lit area, or a car park displaying Park Mark signage www.parkmark.co.uk

Cash points

- Don't use a cash point if you see anything suspicious
- Ensure your PIN cannot be seen
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash

When out at night

- Ensure someone knows where you are and when you'll be home
- · Don't leave bags unattended
- Drink responsibly, never accept drinks from strangers, don't leave drinks unattended
- Don't drink and drive
- · Don't use unlicensed taxis
- Never walk home alone, don't use alleys or walk across open spaces, stick to well-lit areas

Best Bar None Scheme 2017 Launches

This year's scheme has now launched with applications being taken for pubs, bars and clubs who ensure their customers are as safe as possible through staff training and measures to prevent theft and drink driving.

The scheme is funded by the Police and Crime Commissioner for Nottinghamshire and Nottinghamshire County Council.

In 2015/16 it cost the Council £42,000 to clear up illegally fly tipped waste.

Dumping of waste is a serious offence which can result in an unlimited fine or an offender being sent to prison.

What to do if you discover fly-tipped waste

If you discover fly-tipped waste please:

- Do not touch the waste, it can be dangerous
- · Do take note of its exact location
- Do not disturb the site there may be evidence that could help identify the culprits and lead to their prosecution.

Household duty of care

Beware of unlicensed waste movers. They could cost you a penalty of up to £5,000 on conviction in the Magistrates Court. You must ensure that the person who you employ to take control of your waste is licensed to do so.

Reasonable steps you should take include:

- Asking the waste carrier to provide you with their full address and telephone number.
- Asking to see their waste carrier licence issued by the Environment Agency or Natural Resources Wales.
- Contacting the Environment Agency directly on 08708 506 506 and ask for a free instant Waste Carrier Validation Check. Alternatively you can check online on the Environment Agency website.



What to do if you see fly-tipping in progress

Please try to record as much information about the incident as possible, but don't put yourself in danger. We would advise you NOT to secretly monitor or record offenders. Remember that fly-tippers are acting illegally and may become violent if they realise they have been observed. Make a note of the following:

- · The date, time and place where it happened
- · What the waste looks like and how much there is
- A description of any vehicles involved and the vehicle registration if possible
- · A description of the offender if possible.

30 Hours Free Childcare

Since September, three and four year olds whose parents are working are eligible for 30 hours of free childcare a week.

The government is introducing the extra free childcare to help more parents to return to work, or work more hours, by reducing the significant cost of childcare. To be eligible, both parents (or sole parent in a lone parent family) must be:

- working a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at national minimum wage (under 25 year olds) or national living wage (over 25 years old)
- earning less than £100,000 per year.

Fire Safety At Home

Following the tragic events at Grenfell Tower, the Council set up a task group to ensure its homes were safe and to reassure residents. The Council doesn't own any high rise



(over 18m) accommodation blocks nor has it used cladding made from the same material as at Grenfell Tower. Regular fire safety checks take place.

Here's some fire safety advice to help keep you and your family safe:

- Smoke detectors give an early warning of fire. It is recommended that one is fitted on each level in your home. Test them regularly & always replace the batteries!
- Make an "escape plan" so that everyone knows the safest way out and practice it regularly.
 Remember, the electricity supply may be off and it may be dark if there's a fire.
- Ensure internal doors open and close correctly and fit in the frames when closed. Well-fitting solid doors help contain any fire giving you and your family vital minutes to escape if there's a fire.
- Are there any frayed or loose floor coverings? Are stair hand rails in place and secure? These faults may cause a slip or fall which, if there's a fire may affect your ability to escape quickly.
- Keep your hallway, stairs and landing free from any obstacles so you can leave your home without anything getting in the way.
- Keep the door key handy and close to the door; this could save valuable time.

Applying For a Mutual Exchange

If you are a Social Housing tenant and want to swap homes with any other Social Housing tenant in the UK, you can apply for a mutual exchange.

Those who want to apply for a mutual exchange can advertise their property on websites such as Homeswapper and Swap and Move, for properties either locally or in another part of the country. This process is often much quicker than finding a property on the Council's Housing waiting list.

The following conditions must be met before a tenant can exchange, including:

- No outstanding rent
- No breach of their tenancy
- Property must be a suitable size for their needs,

Once a tenant has found another tenant they would like to swap properties with and both are in agreement, applications will need to be made to each landlord. Once authorised, the tenants will be invited to complete the relevant paperwork with their landlords. If you are not a Broxtowe Borough Council Housing tenant (for example are a Housing Association tenant), you must contact your own housing provider.

From application to completion, a Mutual Exchange usually takes about six weeks.
