NOTICE OF MAKING

BROXTOWE BOROUGH COUNCIL (TECHNOLOGY DRIVE) CIVIL ENFORCEMENT **OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES ORDER 2018**

Notice is hereby given that on the 26th of January 2018 Broxtowe Borough Council made the above Order ("the Order") under its powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended and under the Traffic Management Act 2004 as amended and all other enabling powers.

The Order relates to a new parking place provided by the Council at the location listed in the Schedule of Parking Places and Charges below and is intended to come into operation on Monday 12 March 2018 (or as soon as possible thereafter).

The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (County of Nottingham) Designation Order 2008 brought civil parking enforcement into force in the relevant areas of the County of Nottinghamshire, including the Borough of Broxtowe, on 12 May 2008.

The Order restricts use of the parking place covered by this Order to vehicles of a specified class parked in such positions, on such days, during such times and for such periods as specified at each parking place; and prohibited parking in bays marked for use by disabled persons unless the vehicle is displaying a valid Disabled Persons Badge and currently set time clock.

The Notice of Proposal to make the Order was published in the Nottingham Evening Post on 16th November 2017. The effect of the Order is as shown in that Notice of Proposal, with no amendments; save for a typo/misspelling correction of the word technology in the title reference only, to the Notice of Proposal.

The word technology in the title only, of the aforementioned was affected by the misspelling of one word. It said 'Tecnology' instead of 'Technology' all other spellings of the word and references to technology throughout the Notice of Proposal and other related documents were correct.

The Order will introduce conditions of use for the new parking place, as described in the attached Schedule of Parking Places.

Penalty Charges

Penalty

if paid after service of charge certificate)

£70 (£35 where paid For contraventions in relation to parking in loading areas; within 14 days; £105 designated disabled persons bays; a restricted area; a permit bay or a bay not designated for that class of vehicle; for using a vehicle in connection with the sale of goods; and for causing an obstruction. For parking in a permit bay without clearly displaying a valid permit.

£50 (£25 where paid within 14 days: £75 if paid after service of charge certificate)

For parking for longer than the maximum period allowed; parking beyond the bay markings; returning to the same parking place on the same day within the specified period; parking when the parking place is closed; parking for a purpose other than that permitted; parking with the engine running where prohibited. For contraventions related to parking charges, including: parking without payment of the parking charge; parking after expiry of the paid time; parking without clear display of the relevant ticket(s), voucher or parking clock; and parking without additional payment(s) to extend the parking stay.

SCHEDULE OF PARKING PLACES, TIMES AND CHARGES OF USE UNDER THE ORDER

1. Pay and Display Car Parks, Category H: Long Stay Technology Drive, Beeston.

Permitted Times of Use: Public parking Monday to Sunday inclusive daily between 8:00am and 8:00pm with no time limit and a continuous period not to exceed 7 days. Except bank holidays, but including Good Friday.

Waiting Period Up to 24 hours (arrival between Midnight and 10.00am Monday to Friday)	Charge £4.50p
Up to 24 hours (arrival between 10.00am and Midnight Monday to Friday, arrival anytime Saturday or Sunday)	£2.30p

Up to 6 days	£14.00p
Up to 7 days	£16.00p
Quarterly parking permit	£125.00p

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order (which was made on 26th January 2018) or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from 26th January 2018, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
