1. Welcome and Introductions

2. Apologies

Apologies were received from Cllr Joan Briggs and 1 resident.

3. Police Update – (SM)

No PCSOs or Police Officers were able to attend the meeting, but a report was received from Inspector Wragg.

All crime across the two beat areas has risen considerably compared to the same period last year. Between 01/04/2017 and 24/01/2018 there have been 321 crimes recorded compared to 218 over the same period last year (16/17). This represents an increase of 47%.

Burglary of homes, outbuildings and commercial premises has increased by 58%. Equating to 46 offences over the last 10 months. There have also been 44 offences recorded of vehicle crime.

The greatest volume of offending that has contributed the largest increase in recorded crime is theft from shop. This is showing an increase of 74 offences. This is largely down to Chilwell Retail Park. TK Max is the business with the greatest demand for Police at this site.

On more positive note, ASB has shown a decrease by 18%. Further information about crime can be found on Inspector Wragg's blog.

Two officers from Nottinghamshire Highways Department gave an update on parking issues, in the area.

Councillors are still working on getting restrictions put in place but until these are established nothing can be enforced.

6. 2018 Chilwell Munitions Factory Commemoration

Gill Linton-Smith and Warrant Officer Tim Duffin gave a presentation regarding the refurbishment of the war graves in St Mary's Church in Attenborough. They also gave details regarding replacing the memorial cross, that has deteriorated over time, a gravel pathway and a raised stone bed. There is also a week of events starting on Monday 25 June 2018 and ending in Sunday 1 July which marks the 100th anniversary.

7. Attenborough Elderflower Community Gardens

No-one was available to give a talk/presentation.

8. Broxtowe Borough Council Update

RJ gave an update on Beeston Square and that it is likely that a cinema operator and food/beverage development will be established on the site, this would include live performances and streaming of live music.

Consultation went out to the public on the future of the Town Hall. The consultation opened on 12 December 2017 and closed on 16 January 2018.

It is understood that a "Save the town hall" petition will be submitted to Full Council on 31 January.
