- Reducing litter and fly tipping to make Broxtowe cleaner
- Maintaining and improving the green infrastructure of Broxtowe
- Increasing recycling, composting and reducing residual waste

Advice was given on making sure you are keeping your property secure. Now darker nights are upon us it is suggested that you leave a light on or a radio so it appears that someone is at home.

Advice was also given regarding leaving your expensive bike in a wooded shed that is easily accessed.

A resident reported that at the junction of Queens Road and Meadow Lane there were accidents on a regular basis and what could be done regarding this. This was a Highways issue that Councillors would raise with the County Council to see what statistics they have and if any measures are being considered.

4. Broxtowe Borough Council update

Cllr Jackson gave an update on Beeston Square. The planning committee has granted full consent for the town's new cinema and outline planning consent for the mixed-use and residential building. The development will be 132 new homes along with restaurants, cafes, bars, and a new cinema. The Council has received many expressions of interest for the residential units, which will help finance the cinema/restaurants etc. There will be 20% affordable housing dependent on the developer.

It was agreed at Full Council on 17 October 2018 to sell Beeston Town Hall to Cornerstone Church. The proposals are to form a café at the front of the building and other rooms to be used for Community groups, with the garages at

the rear of the Town Hall to be retained as craft workshops. The car park at the rear would be retained for employees' use.

A unitary Council was discussed with all 8 Borough and District Councils within the county joining with the County Council to form one unitary Council, there were pros and cons for both options.

Cllr Jackson advised that there is huge duplication, and savings of £30 million can be made by reducing bureaucracy. All district councils are putting local plans in place and will need to demonstrate how local provision will be made – ultimately the decision rests with the Government.

5. Residents' Issues

- Council reserves – A resident asked what the position was with Council reserves, Cllr Jackson advised that the reserves have not used and they are up on 3 ½ years ago.
- Beeston on sands was discussed and how successful this had been over the last 2 summers. This will not be able to take place in the same location next summer as building works will have started in this area. It was hoped that this could be moved to a Recreation Ground within Beeston.
- Central College – Teaching at this location has now ceased and administration has moved in on a temporary basis. There is a possibility of this being used as a care facility.
- Bartons – Full planning permission has been given and they are currently in talks with Planning.
- Parking issues was mentioned again and the Councillors will continue lobbying Nottinghamshire County Council for a parking scheme to be introduced.
- HS2 – The Councillors were asked if they were in favour of HS2, they confirmed they were.
- The pavement between the Railway Station and The Paddock was discussed and how uneven the surface was. **ACTION**

A resident gave information on recycling and what could be recycled where. She gave details of various websites where further information could be obtained and details of what Sainsbury's and Tesco recycle at their stores.

A list of where different types of plastic could be recycled was handed out to residents at the meeting, a copy of which is attached.

It was suggested that someone from the recycling department at Broxtowe Borough Council attend the next meeting. **ACTION**
