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• Provide a statement regarding the proposed process and anticipated timescale to meet the identified need.

The work would be undertaken predominantly in-house, involving liaison with the Council's Estates Department and other departments as appropriate. Consultants may be commissioned to undertake particular parts of the process, if necessary.
