1. Welcome and Introductions

3. Update on actions from last meeting

Lloyds Bank is closing.

The petition for the traffic regulations (20mph through Stapleford) is still on line / available in the shops and is being backed by the police.

Nottinghamshire county council has agreed to put up a barrier in next financial year (from April 2019)

Traffic and Transport meeting tomorrow at 11am if residents wanted to attend.

Approximately 50 people attended the HS2 meeting 16 November 2018. There is a Councillor specific meeting around the 20 February 2019 but as yet no agenda has been received so cannot say further.

The pop up Credit Union meeting did not happen as the Credit Union representative did not turn up for the arranged meeting with Councillors.

4. Police Update – LA



LA explained that facts and figures can be read on line at <https://www.nottinghamshire.police.uk/neighbourhood/stapleford> whilst it is important to have these she was at the meeting to hear what residents wanted to talk about instead.

In general shed break-ins / bike theft have gone up and ASB has reduced

LA gave an overview of the Stapleford police service, officers and explained that they are exploring the possibility of a Stapleford base.

Residents explained strongly that drug dealing is an issue across Stapleford and it is suggested that people are quiet due to fear of retribution. There needs to be a stronger police presence.

DG explained that having everything on line was not accommodating older people without access / skills to use computers.

It was suggested by residents that Stapleford needs a strong community hub to give people something to do, especially the children.

Beeston has a shopwatch which seems to be running well. **Action:** RM will discuss creating a shopwatch with local shops to see if there is enough interest.

Ideas were discussed for venues the police could use to speak with the community – Salvation Army café, Coffee City, Helpful Bureau.

Residents' issues for the Police

Action: Drug dealing still occurring on Hickings Lane Park and by Doctors surgery (residents reminded to continue to call 101 or Crimestoppers to report crime and not to post on social media)

Action: Bike marking scheme event on Hickings Lane - details to be emailed to RM.

Action: AM to speak with LA re Independent Living Schemes coffee mornings as a way to listen to older people.

Action: JM recommended to LA to speak with Aldi when it is open to arrange a meeting point for a few hours a week for the police to engage with the community.

5. Local Elections – SR

This year elections will be a little different as residents will be required to take identification to the polling stations as part of a pilot project.

Residents will need to take one photographic ID such as driving licence, bus pass, passport, blue badge or two other forms of ID such as polling card, utility bill statement, bank card or council tax bill. On receipt of the polling card residents will see a list of acceptable ID on the back of the polling card (these will be sent out around 26 March)

Various promotions to raise awareness are planned

A “Local Elector ID” is available for those worried that they do not have two forms of ID mentioned.

Postal votes are not affected. People can register for postal voting from now until 15 April.

Any questions can be discussed by contacting the elections team at the council.
