Update from PCSO Andy Freeman:

Since May 2019 there have been a small number of Burglaries around the area, there have also been a number of burglary others (shed breaks), other than these there is no much more to report.

As it seems we are in for an Indian summer, as they say- please make sure that you are careful when leaving windows and doors open in unoccupied rooms. Check before retiring for the night that all is closed and locked. If you are thinking of going away, then it is worth asking the neighbours to keep an eye on the property. Think about using timer switches for lights and radio at certain times of the day/evenings. If you don't have an alarm system or CCTV then it is worth thinking of having one or both, there are many systems on the market for all prices.

Please also consider what you put in your garden sheds. Valuable items really should be in a brick shed or garage with good locks on the doors. Also, if you are away and not taking your vehicle, please think about where you leave it. Finally, you may want to think about outside security lighting which could cover the shed/garage and rear /front doors or windows.
