Welcome and Introductions	
IJ welcomed the Executive Board to the meeting and introductions were made.	
Apologies of absence	
Apologies of absence received and noted.	

Approval of minutes of the previous meeting	
The minutes dated 14 February 2020 were approved.	
Declarations of interest	
RD explained that any land owners should declare an interest for Items 8 and 9 especially for the Agenda's Key Priorities for any land holdings.	
GT3 Introduction Presentation	
An introductory presentation was given by GT3's company repre- sentatives. They had been commissioned as masterplanners to work with key stakeholders in order to design a realistic vision for Stapleford based on the following key themes:	
Brief and Vision: GT3 would combine a design methodology and vision with key stakeholders for the masterplan.	
<u>Stapleford's Destination</u> : Reference was made to STACK in Newcas- tle which has different community uses during the daytime which could be incorporated into the plan to act as a nucleus for Stapleford. It was suggested to pedestrianise and reduce the length of the high street with a residential area towards the end of the town. GT3 sug- gested smart use of space with different levels of activity including roof top pitches.	
Infrastructure Links: HS2 is central and is in the heart of the master- plan being created. Excellent connectivity to A52/M1/HS2 therefore a vision for hub and tram lines and hotels.	
<u>Promoting Activity</u> : A stronger bid would be to include a Universal Design for different age groups, disabilities and needs to promote activity and tie them all together.	
Sustainable: Consider carbon neutral targets by reducing cars and offer more green space.	
Realistic and Deliverable: GT3 could offer funding expertise and partner councils at reduced borrowing rates to de-risk projects as payment would only be expected upon turnkey.	МВ
ZD asked for GT3 to provide details of their partnering funding mech- anism.	
The next steps would be to agree on the brief at the Stakeholder event on 27 March 2020. This would then enable key stage meet- ings to be scheduled leading up to submission of the bid. Additional suggestions to include a series of associated images relating to the	

key themes and for the bid to be written in the same style throughout perhaps appointing copywriters. DG requested more information on the tram links to be available for the Stakeholder event. MG advised that he would be able to provide an update following a tram meeting on 17 March. WM agreed that it was a unique vision for the area but it should also align with other local towns who are bidding, particularly Long Eaton. Consideration should be given to connectivity with cycle routes to signal to government that we are talking to each other. RD attends Nottinghamshire/ Derbyshire Town Deal meetings so that everyone knows what stage they are at with the STF already being ahead of other authorities. FT asked if there were plans to widen the boundary map given by government but RD advised that this would remain. Any interventions, as part of funding received through the agreement of a Stapleford Town Deal, would need to be spent within the boundary only. However, the prospectus asks for details of further private/public sector money being leveraged as part of the bid and therefore, projects on the periphery that complement the town deal plans would be actively encouraged. Following the presentation GT3 representatives left the meeting. Sign off on full 'Place Analysis Report' from ARUP RD expected ARUP's full report to be available for the next agenda. Feedback from the sub-committee At a meeting on 26 February it was agreed unanimously by the subcommittee to appoint GT3. MB had informed the unsuccessful tenderers.
