STAKEHOLDER IDEAS CAPTURE: 'List of Prioritisation' by the Stapleford Town Deal Stakeholder Group

Introduction

As part of agreeing a Town Deal, the Government produced Towns Fund prospectus asks that the Lead Councils collate as many ideas from their local communities for potential inclusion to a Town Investment Plan, to be submitted at a later date (TBA). In order to obtain a wide array of ideas from the various Stapleford Town Deal stakeholders identified in the prospectus, the Council initially held several consultation exercises with associated email communications, press releases and a social media programme. Some milestones from these early activities include: -

- Online survey running from Wednesday 22nd January Wednesday 12th February 2020 (receiving over 210 responses),
- Hard copies of the survey available from the Stapleford Town Council,
- Leaflet drop to every residential property in the Stapleford Town Deal area from Monday 10th February 2020, introducing households to the Town Deal process and some future milestones, as well as signposting to #MyTown portal to share ideas copy of the boundary detailing the Stapleford Town Deal area available at https://www.broxtowe.gov.uk/staplefordtowndeal
- **Signposting to the #MyTown portal** following the closure of the first online survey, providing the public with continuous opportunity to share their suggestions directly with Government (On Going) available at https://mytown.communities.gov.uk/town/stapleford-nottinghamshire/
- Stapleford Town Deal Stakeholder Group the first meeting was held Friday 24th January 2020, where representatives from various organisations were able to share their ideas on how to improve Stapleford, from the context of their respective organisations future aspirations and strategies.

Stakeholders

A stakeholder is anyone that is likely to be affected or has an interest in the Stapleford Town Deal process. A document with some earlier identified stakeholders is available to view at https://www.broxtowe.gov.uk/staplefordtowndeal however it is accepted this list will constantly evolve throughout the process and is by no means exhaustive.

It is also acknowledged that a significant amount of further consultation work is required with all stakeholders and strong working relationships formed with the potential project delivery partners identified in the tables below. Fostering these relationships with potential delivery partners is vitally important and will later enable any preferred ideas to be progressed by the Executive Board. Effective communication with these groups will also assist the Lead Council in identifying any necessary feasibility studies yet to be commissioned and the eventual business case development for projects where applicable.

List of ideas prioritised

The data from the various consultation exercises above were initially combined to form a larger dataset. The entire dataset of all the stakeholder responses was then summarised, with duplicate responses removed. Where similar ideas were captured, further information of the variations have also provided in the tables below.

An example of this being:

CORE IDEA – Provision of a new Sports Facilities

VARIANT – new Sports Facilities to include 4g football pitches

VARIANT – new Sports Facilities to include floodlighting

VARIANT – new Sports Facilities to include a running track

The summarised list of ideas was then presented at the Stapleford Town Deal Stakeholder Group meeting held on Friday 28th February 2020. The group were asked to prioritise the ideas generated for each investment theme of Urban Regeneration, planning and land use; Skills and Enterprise infrastructure; and Connectivity. Each attendee was asked to rank all the ideas and provide their top 3 for open discussion (as a minimum). The tables below show the summarised ideas in an agreed order of priority.
