Street Art

Commissioned in the town centre to celebrate Beeston's creativity, including two large pieces commissioned by the Council.



Town Hall

Sale of Beeston Town Hall to secure the building's future and create a new facility for the people of Beeston.

Public Sector Hub

Creation of a public sector hub at the Council Offices for residents to access Council, Police and Citizens Advice services in one place.

Cavendish Lodge and Devonshire **Avenue**

Sale of Cavendish Lodge and 14 Devonshire Avenue to provide new homes in Beeston.

BEESTON **MASTERPLAN**

The Masterplan was adopted in 2008 to ensure Beeston's future vitality. It included developing a sustainable evening economy, accessible transport links and promoting high quality town centre development and public realm improvements.

Myfords Site

Planning application being considered to develop this brownfield site

Neville Sadler Court

Permission has been granted to convert the vacant building into an 83 bedroom student accommodation complex.

NEW, EXCITING DEVELOPMENTS

The Square Phase 1

Refurbishment to create a revitalised shopping area and leisure_ facilities to encourage the night time economy. Flats have been converted into a Business Hub to help new businesses grow.

The Square Phase 2

New eight-screen cinema and food and drink outlets due to open in summer 2021, alongside 132 new homes and creation of 155 jobs.

Enterprise Zone

The Nottingham and Derby Enterprise Zone includes two sites in Beeston – the Alliance Boots site and Beeston Business Park, where businesses can benefit from things like business rate discounts, superfast broadband and initial infrastructure finance. The sites will see construction of 985 new homes, 16,000m2 commercial development, 82,000m2 employment floorspace, as well as open space.

Broadgate Park

£87,000 improvements to the play area thanks to the Council's Pride in Parks scheme and external funding.

The Barton Quarter

250 new homes on the site of the former Barton Transport in a £50m scheme which includes two new green spaces.


