Broxtowe's Independent Living Service is all about making life easier.

It enables you to live as independently as possible in your home, whilst you enjoy what the scheme has to offer.

Moving in to one of our quality apartments gives you peace of mind with:

- A lifeline calling system linked to a 24 hour response centre staffed by trained operators who are available 7 days a week.
- A packed programme of social activities.

 A feeling of being safe and secure, without the burden of having to maintain a larger property on your own.

If you're aged 60 and over or have a degree of disability that makes your present home unsuitable, read on to find out more about the new way of life you could enjoy in Broxtowe Independent Living.



We have a team of friendly, enthusiastic and professional staff on hand to help you maintain your independence.

Everyone is different so we take a flexible approach which is tailored to suit your needs.

You'll have a dedicated Independent
Living Co-ordinator who will complete
an I-Plan with you when you first move
in. Your needs are at the centre of the
I-Plan which will help us to identify
areas in which you may require support
to enable you to stay independent
in your own home. The I-Plan will
also identify your care needs and

any money management or benefits you may require and will result in the appropriate referrals.

The I-Plan also focuses on what social activities you might like to get involved in and how they can help you to settle in to your new home. The Independent Living Co-ordinator will be in regular contact with you and update your I-Plan at least every 6 months.

The Independent Living Co-ordinator will not be based at your scheme, but help is always available by calling our dedicated Independent Living



Duty Officer during office hours. In an emergency, you will have access to help by using the 24 hour alarm service which is accessible in your own apartment and throughout the scheme.

If you currently receive additional care and support it may be possible for this to be provided once you move into Independent Living, or alternatively we can help to signpost you to the support you need.

Socialising

Our schemes have a real neighbourhood feel so no one ever feels like a stranger.



There's a whole range of social activities you can get involved in.

There's no pressure though – you can participate as much or as little as you like.

From fun fitness sessions, memory lane discussions and games clubs to crafting activities, we have three dedicated Activities Coordinators who will meet with you

to understand the activities you would like to get involved with. They will organise a range of events and social sessions to help you enjoy your home. Residents also get together to organise their own activities from trips to the seaside to meals out.

We also see lots of friendships blossom and there are plenty of communal facilities where you can meet up for a tea or coffee, enjoy your hobbies or make the most of our beautiful communal gardens.

Friends and family are free to visit you and can also stay overnight in one of our guest rooms for a small charge.





Our Independent Living apartments are purpose built to meet the needs of older people.

With a mixture of spacious apartments and bungalows grouped together to give a real neighbourhood feel.

In addition to your weekly rent, we charge a support charge, which provides the following benefits:



- Self-contained accommodation including kitchen, bathroom, living and separate bedroom area.
- Personalise you decorate and furnish your apartment to your own personal taste.
- Feeling safe and secure each apartment or bungalow has an alarm so you can contact a 24 hour call centre for immediate assistance. All residents are also given a pendant to wear in your home and garden which connects to the alarm service.





- Repairs we are responsible for undertaking most repairs to your home, so you don't have to worry about finding a tradesperson to undertake a repair.
- Laundry rooms many of our schemes have communal laundry rooms with washing machines and drying facilities are available for personal use at no extra cost.



- Home improvements we regularly undertake improvements to kitchens and bathrooms, as well as the communal areas.
- Communal space many of our schemes have beautifully maintained gardens, we also have communal lounges with excellent kitchen facilities and hobby rooms for you to indulge that passion!



Quality apartments in great locations

- Accessibility some of our schemes have lifts so are fully accessible and designed with making mobility as easy as possible.
- Local facilities Many of our schemes are close to local amenities such as shops, GP surgeries and public transport.

- Parking is available at some schemes, including scooter storage.
- Communal areas are cleaned on a regular basis and to a good standard.





There's plenty to do nearby if you want to get out and about too.

As well as nearby towns of Beeston,
Eastwood, Kimberley and Stapleford
with a range of independent
businesses, Nottingham and Derby
City Centres are both easily accessible
by car or public transport.

Want to know more?

To qualify you must be over 60 or have a degree of disability that makes your present home unsuitable and would benefit from the support available in Independent Living accommodation. This would be supported by documentation that shows you are in receipt of high rate (mobility/daily living) Personal Independence Payment (PIP).
